Part II. DESCRIPTION OF ACTIONS

Fondation Eboko is a strong supporter of all the principles of the UN Global Compact and is a passionate advocate of UN SDG number 4 (Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities), SDG 5 (gender equality), SDG 13 (Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts).

In accordance with these principles, the Eboko Foundation has implemented several actions between the years 2020 and 2022. These actions take into account 8 SDGs out of the 17 of the United Nations Organization and seeks to have positive impacts in all three (3) countries in which the organization operates.

Among the main objectives of our different actions are included:

- SDG 4: In 2021, we helped bring several children from disadvantaged backgrounds back to school.
- SDGs 5 and 16: On March 8, 2022, we launched the "Beyond tears and pain, reconstruction" project, a project based on supporting women victims of violence on the path to reconstruction through art therapy workshops and training to enable women to be financially independent in the two Congos. We denounce the systematic use of rape as a weapon of war. For this project, we have obtained the double label UN WOMEN FRANCE and Generation Equality Voices 2022.
- SDGs 8 and 10: We fight against unemployment among young people in rural areas through integration sites in eco-construction (on this site, young people also benefit from training in ancestral eco-construction). Our youth initiatives have been selected as one of the best youth-led initiatives by UN-Habitat Youth 2030 Cities. Initiatives that according to UN-Habitat Youth 2030 Cities demonstrate tremendous leadership and a burning desire to strengthen youth-led action for the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals and have been used as an innovative example of action led by young people and was presented during the 11th session of the World Urban Forum WUF11 - cities of the future within the YOUTH ZONE in Katowice, Poland from June 26 to 30, 2022.
- SDG 11: We are building a 100% ecological village in the North of the Republic of Congo.

The Eboko Foundation has a vision that respects the environment. Indeed, we are working on SDG 13: Since 2020, we have been carrying out awareness campaigns in schools to make students aware of the protection of the Congo Basin (the world's second lung after the Amazon) October 29, 2022, we will launch an inter-school prize on the environment entitled "Draw or tell me the Congo Basin". We also launched eco-gardens in schools in the Republic of Congo.

- SDG 17: We have created a coalition of young people called "Eboko Youth for SDGs" and together we are taking action to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030.

In addition to this, we have signed several partnership agreements with schools in the Republic of Congo to promote the Sustainable Development Goals. We also make donations to orphanages and we help children living with autism spectrum disorder (a disease very little known in Africa and unfortunately associated with "witchcraft").

Thus, we respect the United Nations Global Compact.
